Students are given instruments to practice and they perform for their peers, families, and communities at annual concerts throughout the academic year.

Chamber Music America's New Jazz Works program provides grants to U.S. jazz ensembles to create, perform, and if desired, record new works. The new work may be composed by the ensemble leader or another member of the ensemble.

The Board of Directors of Chamber Music America has made diversity, inclusion, and equity a primary focus of the organization's work. CMA seeks to fulfill its vision for the future, where people of all races, religions, genders, and abilities are able to fully participate in the performance, presentation, and enjoyment of the many styles of small ensemble music. Therefore, CMA's goal in this program is, through the panel review process, to arrive at a final slate of grantees that is representative of the field in terms of race, gender, and style of jazz.

With over 16,000 entries from 140 countries, only 160 entrees received this award, which is 1% of the total. Judges for this years competition include Vijay Iyer, Danilo Perez, and Mike Stern.

Semi-Finalist: 2016 International Songwriting Competition February 2017

February 2016

The Award is granted annually to encourage talented young jazz composers during the earliest stages of their careers. The Herb Alpert Foundation, a non-profit, private foundation established in the early 1980s, makes significant annual contributions to a range of programs in the fields of arts, arts education and compassion and well being. Its funding is directed toward projects in which Herb and Lani Alpert and the Herb Alpert Foundation President play an active role.

Each eligible Submission will be judged by a panel of ASCAP composer members (the "Panel") based on the significance and overall artistry and compositional elements of the musical work or composition. The Panel is selected by the Foundation in the Foundation's sole discretion. Award-recipient selection resides within the sole discretion of the Panel.

August 2011

The School for Improvisational Music (SIM) is the instructional facet of CIM for aspiring students of creative music. Since 2001, SIM has held over 20 intensive workshop sessions for 800 students from all over the globe. The sessions include 2 masterclasses per day, ensemble coaching, a performance and 2 private lessons per week. The SIM faculty consists of a cross-section of the most creative improvisers from the jazz and contemporary music fields.

The SIM experience encompasses ample playing opportunities and discussion of improvisational concepts. SIM is less about teaching through the lens of style and more about the overarching concepts of improvisation, touching on multiple disciplines. That said, students are offered two private lessons per week with our faculty, allowing personal instruction on any musical topic.

Finalist: 2009 Carmine Caruso Jazz Trumpet Competition

June 2009

First held in 1993, The Carmine Caruso International Jazz Trumpet Competition is considered the most prestigious competition for jazz trumpeters in the world. Carmine Caruso was one of the world's greatest brass teachers. It is to the man and his work that the 2013 Carmine Caruso International Jazz Trumpet Solo Competition is dedicated.

Caruso was born on November 2, 1904, lived his entire life in New York, and died on May 26, 1987. Although he played all the woodwind and string instruments, Caruso made his living as a saxophone player, performing in ballrooms and on radio shows. He played his last his last club date on his 70th birthday in 1974. Caruso took his first trumpet student in 1942, and within a year had forty brass students. Brass players from all over the world traveled to New York to study with him, and he developed a reputation for being able to help players improve.

Winner: 2007 International Trumpet Guild Jazz Solo Competition

June 2007

The annual ITG Conference features the world's greatest trumpet and brass artists and is indeed THE trumpet event of the year. They have been held at major universities throughout the world. Sessions are devoted to numerous topics including jazz, symphony orchestra, solo recital, chamber music, pedagogy, history, repertoire, performance practices, acoustics, equipment modifications, physiology, psychology, premieres of new works, and all aspects of the trumpet. The Festival of Trumpets Concert features more that 50 professional trumpeters. The annual ITG Conference also offers a significant opportunity to visit with manufacturers, publishers, and dealers who display instruments, mouthpieces, mutes, accessories, sheet music, books, recordings, and other trumpet related products.

Conferences include student performance competitions for Jazz Improvisation, Solo Performance, and Orchestral Excerpts, and a special competition for younger players. Cash awards for performance competitions are made available by the Karl Kletsch Memorial Fund.
